Dr. (Henry) Norman Bethune (1890-1939) was a Canadian physician who in the 1930s spearheaded the implementation of the first practical mobile blood collection and distribution system. His approaches were novel and shaped blood transfusion practices throughout the world. He was one of the first to promote universal access to health care. His creativity in the fields of surgery and blood transfusion were applied during the Spanish Civil War and in China during the Sino-Japanese War, helping to shape modern approaches to critical care on the battlefield. This symposium is held in his honour.
