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### “What We Don’t Know About Massive Transfusion”

Massive hemorrhage is a leading preventable cause of death following trauma, childbirth, and surgery. Therefore, massive hemorrhage protocols (MHPs) are important as standardized, prompt, and team-based approaches to bleeding and coagulopathy are what leads to better outcomes. However, despite the emergence of MHPs as standard of care, much is still unknown about optimal MHP management including: 1) the role and evidence behind pre-hospital transfusion, 2) the appropriate trigger for MHP activation, 3) the ideal resuscitation fluid and/or products, 4) the ideal resuscitation strategy with available components, and 5) adjunctive strategies that improve outcomes.
